TACHINID FLIES deposit eggs directly on or in the body of leafrollers, cutworms and larvae of moths, beetles, sawflies, stink bugs and other insects



PARASITIC WASP prey on aphids, cucumber beetles, cabbage worms, bean beetles and hornworms.



LADY BUGS Feed on aphids, potato beetles, bean beetles and spider mites.



PRAYING MANTIS devour wide range of insects including aphids, beetles, caterpillars and squash bugs.



GROUND BEETLES feed on other beetles, caterpillars, snails, squash vine borers and bud worms.



LACE WINGS feed on aphids, caterpillar eggs and young caterpillars, and potato beetles



HOVER OR SYRPHID FLIES tend to eat aphids, cabbage worms and other caterpillars.



ASSISSIN BUG stab their prey with their proboscis, they inject venom or digestive juices into the body of the prey.
